# THE INVITATORY & PSALTER

Officiant O God, make speed to save us. Assembly O Lord, make haste to help us.

All Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit;

Ogracious light,
pure brightness of the everliving Father in heaven,
O Jesus Christ, holy and blessed!
Now as we come to the setting of the sun,
and our eyes behold the vesper light,

You are worthy at all times to be praised by happy voices,
O Son of God, O Giver of Life,
and to be glorified through all the worlds.

The officiant and assembly recite the psalm responsively by half-verse

PSALM 115	Non nobis, Domine
I	Not to us, O LORD, not to us, but to your Name give glory; * because of your love and because of your faithfulness.
2	Why should the heathen say, * "Where then is their God?"
3	Our God is in heaven; * whatever he wills to do he does.
4	Their idols are silver and gold, * the work of human hands.
5	They have mouths, but they cannot speak; * eyes have they, but they cannot see;

6	They have ears but they cannot hear; * noses, but they cannot smell;
7	They have hands, but they cannot feel; feet, but they cannot walk; * they make no sound with their throat.
8	Those who make them are like them, * and so are all who put their trust in them.
9	O Israel, trust in the LORD; * he is their help and their shield.
10	O house of Aaron, trust in the LORD; * he is their help and their shield.
II	You who fear the LORD, trust in the LORD; * he is their help and their shield.
12	The LORD has been mindful of us, and he will bless us; * he will bless the house of Israel; he will bless the house of Aaron;
13	He will bless those who fear the LORD, * both small and great together.
14	May the LORD increase you more and more, * you and your children after you.
15	May you be blessed by the LORD, * the maker of heaven and earth.
16	The heaven of heavens is the LORD's, * but he entrusted the earth to its peoples.
17	The dead do not praise the LORD, * nor all those who go down into silence;

THE FIRST LESSON Exodus 12:40-51

A reading from the book of Exodus

The time that the Israelites had lived in Egypt was four hundred thirty years. At the end of four hundred thirty years, on that very day, all the companies of the LORD went out from the land of Egypt. That was for the LORD a night of vigil, to bring them out of the land of Egypt. That same night is a vigil to be kept for the LORD by all the Israelites throughout their generations. The LORD said to Moses and Aaron: This is the ordinance for the passover: no foreigner shall eat of it, but any slave who has been purchased may eat of it after he has been circumcised; no bound or hired servant may eat of it. It shall be eaten in one house; you shall not take any of the animal outside the house, and you shall not break any of its bones. The whole congregation of Israel shall

celebrate it. If an alien who resides with you wants to celebrate the passover to the LORD, all his males shall be circumcised; then he may draw near to celebrate it; he shall be regarded as a native of the land. But no uncircumcised person shall eat of it; there shall be one law for the native and for the alien who resides among you. All the Israelites did just as the LORD had commanded Moses and Aaron. That very day the LORD brought the Israelites out of the land of Egypt, company by company.

Here ends the lesson.

THE SECOND LESSON John 15:1-11

A reading from the Gospel of John:

Jesus said, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned.

If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples. As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

Amen.


